Let's Get Educated!

Feed The Bin was created with education being a top priority. Due to the program being in all grade levels this year, there are education presentation choices geared towards all students. They are as follows:

1 – General Recycling: (K-12) This presentation discusses what you can and cannot recycle and what happens to your recyclables and will be geared to the age group it is being presented to. 30 minutes

2 – Composting: (Middle or High) This presentation will examine ways and materials that can be composted and the benefits of composting. 30 minutes

3 – All About Plastics: (Middle or High) This presentation will look at all of the “numbers” of plastics and tell about what those numbers mean and examine the recycling capabilities of each one. 30 minutes

4 – The Business of Recycling: (High) This presentation will look at the business side behind the practice of recycling. 30/45 minutes

What Do We “Feed The Bin?”

- All paper except paper towels/kleenex, etc.
- Plastic bottles (emptied/don't worry about caps)
- Glass bottles (emptied/don't worry about caps)
- Newspapers and magazines
- Aluminum cans (emptied)
- Steel cans rinsed out (cafeteria)
- Cardboard (Boxes should be broken down.)
- Paperboard (cereal boxes or other cartons)



This is it! If it isn't on this list then please **don't “feed it to the bin!”**
