What Do We “Feed The Bin?”

- All paper except paper towels/kleenex, etc.
- Plastic bottles (emptied/don't worry about caps)
- Glass bottles (emptied/don't worry about caps)
- Newspapers and magazines
- Aluminum cans (emptied)
- Steel cans rinsed out (cafeteria)
- Cardboard (Boxes should be broken down.)
- Paperboard (cereal boxes or other cartons)



This is it! If it isn't on this list then please **don't “feed it to the bin!”**

Roll Carts

City schools—Your roll carts need to be put out at the curb Tuesday afternoon for the Wednesday morning pick up and then taken back to the regular location Wednesday afternoon.

County schools—Your roll carts need to be put near the dumpster area for the afternoon before your pick up day and then returned to the regular place the next afternoon.
