Step One: Finding the Right College

Finding the best match and fit

- Look at the average GPAs and test scores of desired colleges early!
 - The earlier you look at this, the more time there is to reach goals
- Determine what type of college environment is desired
 <u>Examples: rural vs. urban</u>, small vs. large, etc.

UNC System Schools Minimum Requirements

- Requirements for admission to an NC Public School (ex. App, UNC, NC State, ECU etc).
 - 2.5 cumulative weighted GPA
 - 17 composite ACT score
 - 880 critical reading + math SAT score
 - Higher test scores = more scholarship money
- If you don't meet this minimums you are still eligible to go to private schools and community colleges



Making a list

- Advise your student to make a list of 3-5 schools to apply
 - Reach school(s): Schools a little outside averages (1-2)
 - Match schools: Schools that closely match average GPA and average test scores (2-3)
 - Safety schools: Schools that have guaranteed entry or are well below the averages (1-2)

Step Two: Getting Into College

Important Terms to Know:

- <u>Early decision</u>: students apply early in the application process, if admitted, they must attend the institution (binding)
- <u>Early action</u>: students apply early in application process. If admitted, they are NOT required to attend the institution (non-binding)
 - Apply from October December, hear back by January
- <u>Regular decision</u>: students apply later in the application process, they are NOT required to attend the institution
 - Apply in the spring, hear back in April
- <u>Rolling admission</u>: admissions reps look at applications weekly, and accept students weekly

Parts of College Applications

- Academic rigor (difficulty of classes comparatively)
- Extracurricular involvement
- GPA
- Test scores (ACT or SAT)
- Personal statements/essays
- Letters of recommendation
- Application fee

 - Bring all seniors down to the media center to apply to one college


Step Three: Paying for College

Residency Determination Service (RDS)

- Must complete to be eligible for in-state tuition! (public institutions and community colleges
- ncresidency.org- student must complete!
- You will need:
 - Driver's license numbers, Social Security Numbers, Tag numbers
- Take extreme care in completing!
 - Times out after 25 days

SCHOLARSHIP

FREE money based on need or merit (special talent, achievement or skill)

<u>GRANT</u>

FREE money based on financial need

STUDENT LOAN

NOT free and NOT based on financial need
