The Summer My Life Began by Shannon Greenland (romance, contemporary fiction)

**Elemental by Antony John** (dystopian fiction)

**Storm Warriors** by Elisa Carbone (historical fiction)

**Roanoke: The Mystery of the Lost Colony by Lee Miller** (non-fiction)
