BACKGROUND:

C.M. Eppes Structural Project:

This project is now in the post-bid / value engineering phase. The project bid opening was in August and since then our office has been in cost savings negotiations with the structural engineer and the low-bid contractor. Our initial project estimate from the structural engineer was for a project cost of \$ 1,060,000. On bid day, the low bid contractor (Carolina Restoration and Waterproofing) was at \$ 1,996,992. After value engineering negotiations, the current value of the structural repair project is \$1,150,000. This cost savings was achieved by modifying the scope to include repair work on the severely damaged beams where utility services are required to maintain access and introducing Flowable-Fill at other areas. At this time, we cannot reduce the cost of the repair work without removing square footage from the project. It is recommended that the Board of Education contracts with Carolina Restoration and Waterproofing Inc. for the structural repairs to the concrete floor joists.
