

STUDENT RECOGNITION – HONOR ROLL AND PRINCIPAL’S LIST

The Pitt County Board of Education believes that outstanding academic achievement should be recognized. Each school shall have an honor roll and principal’s list and shall recognize students in grades 3-12 using the criteria established.

GRADES 3-5

- To qualify for the honor roll, students must have all A’s on academic subjects (English/language arts, social studies, math, and science) and all S’s on non-academic subjects.
- To qualify for the principal’s list, students must have all B’s or higher on academic subjects (English/language arts, social studies, math, and science) and all S’s on non-academic subjects.

GRADES 6-8

- To qualify for the honor roll, students must have A’s on all subjects.
- To qualify for principal’s list, students must have B’s or higher on all subjects.

GRADES 9-12

High schools may choose either letter grades or grade point averages to establish the honor roll and principal’s list. The choice of method to be used shall be decided by the school, and communicated to students and parents through the student-**parent** handbook and other publications. The method chosen shall not be changed during the school year.

Letter Grades

- To qualify for the honor roll, students must earn all A’s for the grading period.
- To qualify for principal’s list, students must earn all B’s or higher for the grading period.

Grade Point Average

- To qualify for the honor roll, students must earn a grade point average of 4.0 or higher, and have no letter grade lower than B in an AP course or lower than A in any other course for the grading period.

- To qualify for the principal's list, students must earn a grade point average of 3.0 or higher, and have no letter grade lower than C in an AP course or lower than B in any other course for the grading period.

PROGRAMS OF RECOGNITION

Special recognition for student achievement in the academic, athletic, cultural arts and career and technical areas shall be given according to guidelines established by the Pitt County Board of Education and individual schools.

HONOR SOCIETIES

Pitt County Schools has affiliated with national honor societies and follows the rules and regulations set forth by those organizations.

The administrator of each school shall encourage establishment and maintenance of such organizations that recognize outstanding academic achievement. The principal shall appoint and approve sponsors for such organizations.
