# **Progress Reports/Report Cards**

- As shown on the previous slide, students need to show proficiency in all areas to receive an "S" (on/above grade level) on Progress Reports or Report Cards.
- If students show proficiency in some areas, but not in the majority, they will receive an "I" (below grade level) on Progress Reports or Report Cards.
- If students show little to no proficiency in all areas, they will receive a "U" (well below grade level) on Progress Reports or Report Cards.

# Communication

# **Accelerated Reader**

- STAR Test: We will STAR test your child each 9 weeks to determine their text level. This will allow them to go to the library and check out leveled readers (with colored dots) within their reading level.
- Point goals will increase each 9 weeks. This is an individualized goal to meet your students' needs.
- If students fall behind on meeting their AR goals, we will contact you so that you can encourage them to read and test.
- Students need to check out AR books from the library and read their AR books at home each night for at least 15 minutes. This ensures they are ready to return to school and take an AR test the following day.

## Homework

- Once testing has been completed, homework will begin. This will be the 1<sup>st</sup> week of October.
- On Monday morning, your child will write their homework in their planner. This planner will go home on Monday and be returned on Friday with all completed homework.
- On Monday and Wednesday nights, your child will have one math sheet as well as 15 minutes of supplemental reading (AR books).
- On Tuesday and Thursday nights, your child will choose two spelling activities to practice their spelling words as well as 15 minutes of supplemental reading (AR books).

# Behavior

- We will send home behavior folders daily with colors recorded within the folders. Please to sign this folder each night and return the next day so I know that you have seen it. It is your child's responsibility to get this home to you and back to us each day.
- Children can move their clips up and down throughout the day based off of their behavior. If a child clips down to red, their clip will remain at that color due to the amount of times we have had to redirect them.
- There are multiple positive reinforcements such as treasure box on Fridays, steps in the hall, etc.
- Consequences vary depending on child but can be walking a couple laps at recess, silent lunch, etc.
