Dear Parent/Guardian:

I hope the school year has started successfully for all of you. As a parent/guardian of a student in G.R Whitfield School, I am writing this letter to let you know that G.R. Whitfield School, has been designated as a Targeted Support & Improvement Additional Targeted Support (TSI-AT) school by the North Carolina State Board of Education. As stated in ESSA Section 1111(d)(2), North Carolina had to identify schools for targeted support and improvement. TSI-AT schools in North Carolina are those that have a subgroup that is under-performing. The intent of this opportunity is to improve educational outcomes for all students, close achievement gaps, increase equity, and improve the quality of instruction.

As a TSI-AT school, G.R. Whitfield is required to develop a comprehensive plan that specifically addresses how the school will improve student achievement. The plan will also include how our district will support us and monitor the progress of our school. The comprehensive plan will address the following areas:

- Classroom Management
- Standards-aligned Instruction
- Professional Learning Communities (PLCs)
- Instructional Leadership
- Recruitment & Retention of Effective Teachers
- Support for Grade-to-Grade Transitions
- Implementation of a Tiered Instructional System
- Data-Driven Decision Making
- Student Support Services
- Family and Community Engagement

We have set the following goals for G.R. Whitfield this year:

- G.R. Whitfield will implement the PLC process with fidelity to move from Implementing
 to Developing as indicated by "The Professional Learning Communities at Work
 Continuum: Building a Collaborative Culture Through High-Performing Teams" Rubric.
 (Learning by Doing: A Handbook for for Professional Learning Communities at Work,
 3rd Edition p. 80-81)
- G.R. Whitfield will increase grade level proficiency on End of Grade Assessments by 10 percentage points by providing differentiation, supplemental and intensive instruction

where needed.

- G.R. Whitfield will progress from Emerging/Developing to Operationalizing with the implementation of a Three-Tiered Instruction/Intervention Model as indicated by Items 29-35 on the Facilitated Assessment of MTSS-School Level (FAM-S).
- G.R. Whitfield will create a culture of equity and cultural awareness through the creation of an equity team consisting of at least 20% of our staff members.
- G.R. Whitfield will make a commitment to improving our core instruction through the Learning Focused Model by providing targeted professional development, discussing instructional practices and data in PLCs, and intentional use of EVAAS to close gaps for our students.

Our students need to experience higher achievement levels, but it will require hard work on the part of staff, students and families. Here are some strategies G.R. Whitfield School will be implementing:

- Targeted intervention during schoolwide intervention block utilizing research based interventions.
- Tiered process of ensuring all children have access to core curriculum.
- Utilization of i-Ready for individualized instruction to meet students where they are currently performing academically as well as targeted small group instruction.
- Remediation teachers target small group instruction to close instructional gaps in student learning.

Parent engagement is at the heart of our school improvement efforts. Here are some ways we can work together:

- Make sure that both you and your student are aware of academic expectations set for your student this school year. A list of learning objectives in student-friendly language is available from your student's teacher(s).

- Make sure that your student is prepared and attends school each day.
- Monitor your student's homework.
- Monitor the progress your student is making and attend meetings with your student's teacher(s).
