- student has felt well for 24 hours.
- Confirmed positive test for COVID-19: 10 days after the first date symptoms began or if no symptoms, 10 days after date of COVID-19 test with no fever for 24 hours (without the use of fever reducing medicine), AND student has no symptoms, including cough and shortness of breath.
- Household exposure (students living in the same house with someone who has COVID-19 symptoms or who was confirmed positive for Covid-19): Students must quarantine while housemate recovers AND 10 days after the date of housemate's positive test or onset of symptoms. In addition, the exposed individual (s) quarantine period does NOT begin until Day 11, with the option to test on Day 16. PCS requires all housemates to complete the full quarantine period and no exceptions are allowed. Please contact school for further guidance on return date.
- Outside of household exposure: 10 days after the last date of exposure to a person with COVID-19 symptoms or who was confirmed positive AND student has no development of symptoms (Please see guidance for negative COVID-19 test).
- Written confirmation of alternate diagnosis other than COVID-19 is required (example: stomach virus, ear infection, strep throat) follow normal PCS polices to return to school.
