The James Milton Oakley Memorial STEM Scholarship

Mr. Milton Oakley was born and raised in Virginia. He overcame poverty as a young man by embracing physical and mental hard work, and this became a hallmark of his character. Though his parents worked hard, they only had a middle-school education and struggled to provide for their children. Milton decided as a young teen that he wanted to have an easier life than his parents had. He knew that the key to a better life was education. Although his family had no hope of sending him to college, he used his work ethic and character to build a future for himself beginning at the Newport News Shipyard Apprentice School in 1958 as a pattern designer. He earned the top spot in his Apprentice School class and won a full scholarship to the University of Michigan. He earned two bachelor degrees in both Mechanical Engineering and Mathematics as a scholarship student. In 1967, he won the only National Society of Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering scholarship in the USA. He returned to the University of Michigan and earned a Masters in Mechanical Engineering. He spent his career working as a mechanical engineer with a specialty in weapons elevators on the US Naval Fleet.

In 2013, at 73 years of age, Milton was called home after a courageous battle with skin cancer. Milton tackled his illness with all of the tenacity that was characteristic of how he approached life. His faith in God and his love for family sustained him through the last few months of his illness. Milton had a dry wit and self-effacing sense of humor, which were blessings to all who knew him.

To honor Mr. Oakley's memory, his family is awarding two scholarships this year:

• 2 x \$1000 for students attending a four-year college

Recipients must meet the following criteria:

- Aspiration to major in **STEM** courses in college (Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math)
- Demonstrated ability to overcome hardship or challenges as evidenced in an essay
- Demonstrated ability to clearly state career goals in an essay
- 2 Letters of recommendation from a teacher, guidance counselor, or principal of current high school
- Weighted GPA of no less than **3.1** for the community college applicant and no less than **3.4** for the four-year degree applicant
- Demonstrated interest in science/math/engineering high school coursework
- Clean criminal history
- Candidates with demonstrated financial need MAY be given preference
