Graduation Requirements

- > Familiarize yourself with your student's Graduation Requirements
- > Transcripts: Pitt County School and Pitt Community College
- College Transfer Credit Grade Requirement:
 "C" or better

College Planning

- Narrow down your College list: Utilize your AVID
 College Crate and finalize college choices
- Create a master calendar including tests dates, recommendation timeline and college and scholarship application due dates
- Contact College Board (SAT) or ACT to send your test scores directly to your prospective colleges (some colleges allow you to self-report scores, NC State)

College Planning

- > Finalize college choices
- > Know your application deadlines
- > Ask for recommendations
- > Prepare essays and have them proof-read
- Request high school transcripts and Pitt Community College transcripts

Application Process

- Submit applications for regular decision, early decision, early notification, and rolling admission
- Common Application: Commonapp.org
- College Foundation of North Carolina: CFNC.org (North Carolina Colleges only)
- Complete Residency Determination Status online application via CFNC.org
- > Send Transcripts

DEFINITIONS OF ADMISSION OPTIONS IN HIGHER EDUCATION



STUDENTS: WHICH COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCESS BEST SUITS YOU?

Non-Restrictive Application Plans

Regular Decision

DEFINITION:

Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Rolling Admission

DEFINITION:

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Early Action (EA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are not restricted from applying to other institutions and have until May 1 to consider their options and confirm enrollment.

Restrictive Application Plans

Early Decision (ED)

DEFINITION:

Students make a commitment to a first-choice institution where, if admitted they definitely will enroll. The application deadline and decision deadline occur early.

COMMITMENT:

BINDING

Restrictive Early Action (REA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA or REA to other institutions. If offered enrollment, they have until May 1 to confirm.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are responsible for determining and following restrictions.

Recommendations

- > Ask for a recommendation at least 3 weeks in advance of the due date
- Ask those who know you best to write a recommendation letter for you
- Provide the recommending adult with a copy of your resume
- > Thank you notes to recommenders

High School Resume

- In many ways, applying to college is very similar to applying for a job, therefore we recommend you have a resume
- The goal of a good resume is to list your education, activities, community service, awards, employment history, interests and references and to demonstrate what you bring to the table

- Check selected admissions criteria to know which tests are required, i.e. SAT, ACT, SAT Subject Tests
- Send test scores directly to the college or scholarship committee.
- > SAT/ACT fee waivers are available based upon income requirements.
- ASVAB Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery
- WorkKeys Examination
