Parent & Family Engagement Academy

The Family Engagement Academy is a yearlong training that will assist the Title I Contacts
in strengthening home school partnership practices by connecting engagement practices
to student outcomes, turning traditional family events into capacity building learning
opportunities, and creating a culture of engagement at their school. Below is a draft of the
Academy courses.

Foundations of Family Engagement – Part 1

During this session, participants will connect the dots between family engagement and student achievement, reflect on the Core Beliefs of family engagement, and discuss the differences between involvement, engagement, and empowerment. We encourage the principals to join the Title I coaches for the morning portion of this session. 6 hrs.

Foundations of Family Engagement – Part 2

During Part 2, participants will explore the components of the Dual Capacity
 Framework from the Challenge, to the Essential Conditions, to the Program and Policy
 Goals to the Capacity Outcomes. Virtual - 2 hrs.

<u>Transforming Traditional Family Engagement Events</u>

■ In this session, instructional coaches will apply the theories of adult learning and the Dual Capacity Building Framework to implement family engagement initiatives that build families capacity to support learning at home. Virtual - 2 hrs.

o Implementing Effective Home-School Communication

 From newsletters to the website, to social media, liaisons will engage in hands-on practice for ensuring home-school communication is available, accessible, culturally appropriate, and two-way. Virtual - 2 hrs.

Differentiating Family Support

• Unfortunately, there is not a one-size fits all approach to engaging families. In this session, participants will learn about and will practice how to differentiate and tier family support. Virtual - 2 hrs.
