Student Progress Reports & Communication

We believe families should be well-informed about their child's academic progress. We provide several types of reports throughout the year to keep you updated:

 Progress Reports: Sent home with students every 4½ weeks to provide a mid-quarter update on academic performance, behavior, and effort.


 Report Cards: Sent home with students every 9 weeks to report final grades for each quarter.

 Weekly Take-Home Folders: Sent home every Wednesday, these folders include student work samples, school newsletters, flyers, and teacher notes.

 Student Planners (Grades 3-5): Used daily to track assignments, reminders, and short notes between teachers and families.

Assessment Reports

 i-Ready Diagnostic Reports (Math & Reading): Shared with families twice a year—Fall and Spring—typically during parent-teacher conferences or sent home with an explanation of your child's growth and progress.

 mCLASS/DIBELS Reading Reports (K-3): Provided three times a year—BOY (Beginning of Year), MOY (Middle of Year), and EOY (End of Year)—to track reading fluency and foundational skills.
